2025 Deer Rifle Sight-In

First — <u>Safety</u> is always our number one concern so here at Beaverbrook we live by the NRA's Firearm Safety Rules.

- * Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- * Always keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
- * Always keep the firearm unloaded, and the action open, until you are ready to use.

When you come to the range, <u>leave your guns in their case</u> and bring them, and your <u>ammunition</u>, to the range building for the Range Safety Officer (RSO) to inspect.

When a "Cease Fire" is called everyone must unload and open the actions, place the firearm on the bench or rack and step back behind the yellow line. You <u>must</u> remain there until the RSO declares the range "Hot" only then may you approach and touch your gun and resume shooting.

Never argue with an RSOs if you do — you to be asked to leave.

Now for the business end of things.

- The dates are every Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Saturday from September 23rd to November 16th check the club's website calendar.
- The times each day are from 9:00am to 5:00pm or sunset.
- We have ranges out to 200 yards.
- Only firearms legal to hunt whitetail deer are allowed.
- This is for sighting in a firearm, not for casual shooting (plinking).
- The cost is \$20.00 per person with a two (2) gun limit.
- Spotting scopes, sand bags, targets, and help are all included.
- Bring hearing and eye protection, ear plugs are available for a fee.
- Bore sighting of a scope is also available for a fee.
